- 3. The authority **must** approve Section 1, Annual Governance Statement, before approving Section 2, Accounting Statements, and both **must** be approved and published on the authority website/webpage **before 1 July 2024.**
- 4. An authority with either gross income or gross expenditure exceeding £25,000 or an authority with neither income nor expenditure exceeding £25,000, but which is unable to certify itself as exempt, or is requesting a limited assurance review, **must** return to the external auditor by email or post (not both) **no later than 30 June 2024.** Reminder letters will incur a charge of £40 +VAT:
  - the Annual Governance and Accountability Return Sections 1 and 2, together with
  - · a bank reconciliation as at 31 March 2024
  - an explanation of any significant year on year variances in the accounting statements
  - · notification of the commencement date of the period for the exercise of public rights
  - Annual Internal Audit Report 2023/24

Unless requested, do not send any additional documents to your external auditor. Your external auditor will ask for any additional documents needed.

Once the external auditor has completed the limited assurance review and is able to give an opinion, the Annual Governance and Accountability Section 1, Section 2 and Section 3 – External Auditor Report and Certificate will be returned to the authority by email or post.

## **Publication Requirements**

Under the Accounts and Audit Regulations 2015, authorities must publish the following information on the authority website/webpage:

Before 1 July 2024 authorities **must** publish:

- Notice of the period for the exercise of public rights and a declaration that the accounting statements are as yet unaudited;
- Section 1 Annual Governance Statement 2023/24, approved and signed, page 4
- Section 2 Accounting Statements 2023/24, approved and signed, page 5

Not later than 30 September 2024 authorities must publish:

- · Notice of conclusion of audit
- Section 3 External Auditor Report and Certificate
- Sections 1 and 2 of AGAR including any amendments as a result of the limited assurance review. It
  is recommended as best practice, to avoid any potential confusion by local electors and interested
  parties, that you also publish the Annual Internal Audit Report, page 3.

The Annual Governance and Accountability Return constitutes the annual return referred to in the Accounts and Audit Regulations 2015.

# Guidance notes on completing Form 3 of the Annual Governance and Accountability Return (AGAR) 2023/24

- The authority **must** comply with *Proper Practices* in completing Sections 1 and 2 of this AGAR. *Proper Practices* are found in the *Practitioners' Guide\** which is updated from time to time and contains everything needed to prepare successfully for the financial year-end and the subsequent work by the external auditor.
- Make sure that the AGAR is complete (no highlighted boxes left empty) and is properly signed and dated. Any amendments must be approved by the authority and properly initialled.
- The authority should receive and note the Annual Internal Audit Report before approving the Annual Governance Statement and the accounts.

- No evidence was found of any risk management or checking if the insurance was appropriate and adequate. No internal financial controls were documented. Without these the authority would not have been able to determine if they had adequately planned for any identified risks. Recommend that all processes are reviewed and/or implemented with at least an annual risk assessment.
- D A minute in March 2024 states surplus budget and precept agreement. No evidence can be found that a budget was documented. Recommend that a budget is created before the precept value is set and this is published, minuted and periodic checks are made to ensure it is being adhered to. Unless this is done the Council will not be able to see the state of their finances.
- I No evidence was found of periodic bank reconciliations. Recommend that each bank statement is reconciled upon receiving it, to ensure that the accounts, invoices and minutes tally with the statements. Recommend these are dated and signed by the RFO. Unless this is done the Council will not be able to see that their finances are correct.
- L No evidence was found the authority published the required information on their website. Recommend that the required data is published. The public will not be able to see the data unless directly requested from the Council.
- M No evidence was found that the authority had advertised anywhere the public rights for 2022-23 AGAR. The public would therefore not have been able to see how and when they could request access to the data. Recommend that this year they are advertised correctly on the website and/or approved minutes confirming the dates set.
- N No evidence was found that the authority had complied with the publication requirements for 2022/23 AGAR. The public would therefore not have been able to see the data. Recommend that this year all the required data is published as per AGAR page 1 guidance notes.
